

The Art work of Tarrytown artist Camie Isabella Salaz will be on display at the Warner Library for the month of May. The exhibition entitled “Love and Thought” celebrates the marriage of Art and Literature and coincides with the grand opening of Warner Library’s beautifully renovated third floor.

Camie Isabella Salaz is a renown professional painter, classically trained in New York City. She and her husband Kenneth, who is a painter of landscapes in the great Hudson River School Tradition, moved from the City with their son Emerson who is now in kindergarten at John Paulding.

Last summer, both Camie and Kenneth, were awarded the “Artist in Residence” at Chateau La Napoule in the South of France. While there, Camie created several works inspired by the architecture and gardens around the Chateau. For this coming Exhibition at the Warner Library, Camie has chosen four of her favorite paintings from her time at La Napoule and has combined them with four of her favorite poems by poet and philosopher Ralph Waldo Emerson.

She is reworking the paintings, adding figures and narrative inspired by the poetry, to the garden scenes, bringing together a love of nature and a love of ideas.
